1. Outline of the Games

1.1 Basic Information

The Deaflympics combines the words "Deaf" and "Olympics." The Deaflympics is an international "Olympics Games for Deaf and hard of hearing people".

The Deaflympics is organised by the International Committee of Sports for the Deaf (ICSD) and, like the Olympics, is held every four years with separate summer and winter Games. Key features of the Deaflympics include being primarily organised and run by Deaf community organisations themselves, and the use of International Sign as the communication medium for the Games.

This will be Japan's first time hosting and historic Games marking the 100th anniversary of the first Deaflympics, held in Paris in 1924.

Through hosting the Games, we aim to broaden society's understanding of deafness, sign language, and Deaf sports. We strive to realize an inclusive society where people with and without disabilities, regardless of gender, nationality, or other differences, respect and support one another.



[Initiatives for Hosting the Games]

•"TOKYO FORWARD 2025: 100 Days To Go for the TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS!"

With 100 days left until the start of the Games, a commemorative event was held on Thursday, August 7th at the venue, FUTAKO TAMAGAWA RISE.

"Deaflympics Challenge" (Tryouts)

In June of last year, tryouts were held to discover promising athletes from all over Japan in four sports (handball, shooting, taekwondo, and wrestling). In these sports, there has been little progress in discovering and training athletes due



to reasons such as the lack of a National Sports Federation. Ten athletes have been selected from the tryouts to represent Japan at the Deaflympics, marking the first time in the history of the Deaflympics that Japanese athletes will be competing.

"Universal Communication (UC)"

We utilise universal communication (UC) devices that allow everyone to communicate smoothly, regardless of nationality or disability. (See p.24 for details.)

·"Sign Yell"

This is a new cheering style based on Japanese sign language and people who see the world visually to enable everyone, whether they can hear or not, to express their support for deaf athletes. (For details, see p. 26)

- · "Children's Participation"
- ▶Watching the Games and Experiential Activity Project

Children from schools will watch the Games at each venue. There will be experiential activities such as deaf sports at Deaflympics Square (selected and implemented at the discretion of individual schools).

In addition to enabling children to watch and experience the Games while receiving commentary on the events and cheering with sign yells, we will also provide programs designed to help children deepen their learning through the Games. Programs include prior learning and reviews at each school.

"Children from the Disaster-affected Areas Invited to Watch the Games"

Children from the disaster- affected areas (Iwate, Miyagi, Fukushima, and Ishikawa prefectures) will be invited to watch the Deaflympics to experience the wonderfulness of sports, and the hopes and dreams of children by watching the Games at the actual venues.

▶ Player Escorts, High-five Kids, Tray Bearers at Medal Ceremonies As one of the initiatives designed to enable children from schools for the deaf to be involve in the Games, children from schools for the deaf in Tokyo and disaster- affected areas will serve as player escorts and high-five kids when athletes enter the stadium, and as tray bearers at the medal ceremonies.

▶OriHime (Avatar Robot)

For people with disabilities who have difficulty attending the Games in person, the avatar robot "OriHime" will be used to provide an opportunity to remotely participate in the Deaflympics from welfare or medical facilities, and to interact with children watching the Games.

· "SPORTS FUN PARK"

During the Games, from Saturday, 22 November to Monday, 24 November (a substitute holiday), the event will be held in the central plaza of Komazawa Olympic Park, the competition venue, where visitors can interact with athletes, and participate in deaf and parasports experiences. There will also be many booths hosted by companies and organizations to raise awareness of the need to realise an inclusive society.

Opening Ceremony to Commemorate the TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS Football Matches (14 November 2025)

An opening ceremony will be held at J-Village Stadium to commemorate the football matches, which will begin before all other competitions at the Deaflympics. The dance & vocal unit "HANDSIGN" will perform a song to liven up the opening of the football matches.



•TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS Satellite Opening Ceremony (15 November 2025)

A "Satellite Opening Ceremony" will be held at the J-Village all-weather training field, broadcasting live from the opening ceremony at the Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium. In addition to the football teams, local residents also will participate. There will be performances of Ryozen Daiko drumming and hula dancing, and local ingredients from the prefecture will be served.

Invitation to Watch the Game for Children

Approximately 2,200 elementary, junior high, and high school students in the prefecture will be invited to watch the football matches. The participating children are preparing to cheer on the athletes at the matches by attending the outreach program to learn sign language and using original textbooks.

1.5.3 Shizuoka Prefecture [Cycling (Cycling Road/Mountain Bike)]

Introduction to Shizuoka Prefecture

Shizuoka Prefecture is located almost in the centre of Japan and is

known for its rich natural beauty, including Mount Fuji, the sea, and mountains. In particular, the Izu region, where the cycling event will be held, is certified as a Global Geopark and is known for beautiful landscapes created by volcanoes and abundant hot springs.



Izu hosted the cycling events (track and mountain bike) at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, and the prefecture is working to popularize and promote cycling sports, aiming to become a region that can provide a warm and hospitable welcome to cyclists from Japan and abroad.

Introduction to the Cycling Venue

The mountain bike (XCO) course will mainly be the same challenging course that was also used for the Tokyo 2020 Olympics. Each point is named after famous spots or specialties of Izu, or something that expresses the essence of Japan. The scenery of the course, which is challenging but evokes the charm of a Japanese garden, is also one of its attractions.

The road race course is hilly and is also the venue for Japan Championships and international competitions. It combines the view of Mt. Fuji with the safety of not using public roads.





Shizuoka Prefecture's Main Initiatives to Date

Using the Deaflympics as an opportunity, Shizuoka Prefecture is working to create momentum to promote understanding of deaf sports, sign language, and disabilities.

Building Excitement for the Event

We have been holding various events over the past two years to raise awareness of the Deaflympics to as many people as possible.

At the Two-Years-To-Go event, deaf people were invited to the Japan MTB Cup, which was held at the same venue as the Games, to provide commentary in sign language and to test how to verify spectator response.

In addition, we held a One-Year-To-Go event last year, held a 100-Days-To-Go event at a shopping mall this year, and implemented a deaf athlete talk show, sign language experience, and bicycle experience event, with many people participating.

To promote the spread of sign language to young people and broaden the base of people involved in sign language, we held a "training course for sign language supporters" mainly for high school and university students in the eastern part of



the prefecture. Sign language supporters who have completed the course will support the cheering at the venue and will continue to work on the spread of sign language after the Games.

Main Initiatives During the Games

Installation of Transparent Displays at Nearby Tourist Information Centres

To respond to the PR of the Deaflympics and deaf people visiting, transparent displays are installed at the tourist information centres adjacent to the stations and roadside stations around the venue from 1 October to 30 November.

Watching-the-Games Program at School

We will invite elementary, junior high, and special needs school students around the venue to watch the Games and gave outreach classes in advance. In the visiting lectures, local deaf individuals served as lecturers and taught about the outline of the Deaflympics, sign language, and Sign Yell. Approximately 1,300 peoples (including chaperones) are expected to attend the cycling event, which will be held on weekdays.



In addition to serving as the operational base of the Games with functions such as Operation Office, transport hub, media centre and practice venue, Deaflympics Square will offer a variety of programmes, including universal communication and exchange using digital technology for athletes and visitors to enjoy, and opportunities to experience Tokyo's arts and culture.

1.8 Volunteers

Volunteers at the Tokyo 2025 Deaflympics will support the Games in various operational situations, including directional guidance for spectators and athletes, as well as the medal ceremonies, doping tests, and media correspondence at the competition venues and Deaflympic Square.

There were 18,903 applications for 3,000 volunteer positions (3,500 people were selected). A diverse range of people, without regard to disability, nationality, age, or gender, are taking part as volunteers, including hearing individuals as well as individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing, individuals from overseas, and individuals who can and cannot use sign language, etc., and we will work together with one heart to boost the excitement and ensure the success of the Deaflympics to be held for the first time in Japan.

Volunteers wear clothing inspired by cherry blossom pink, the main colour of the tournament; and volunteers and sign language interpreters who can communicate in Japanese Sign Language, International Sign Language, and English wear the following stickers on their clothing.

1.9 Participation of Students from the National University Corporation Tsukuba University of Technology

The Tokyo Sport Benefits Corporation and the National University Corporation Tsukuba University of Technology, the only university for hearing impaired and visually impaired students in Japan, have signed a cooperation agreement to collaborate on the preparation and management of the Tokyo 2025 Deaflympics. The aim of having students with hearing impairments participate in the Games as support staff is to realize Game management that values diverse perspectives, such as providing high-quality services that are considerate to the deaf people, and to provide students with valuable experiences.

About 100 students will participate as support staff at the Games and support the operation of the Games in the Deaflympic Square.

1.10 Medal

The medals for athletes at the Tokyo 2025 Deaflympics were designed with the key points of making deaf athletes feel proud and expressing the essence of Tokyo and Japan.

To express the essence of Tokyo and Japan, the medals feature designs such as cherry blossoms and origami cranes, utilising the skills of Tokyo artisans to achieve an exquisite design.

Medal Design Selection

The medal design was chosen through a vote by 80,543 participants from elementary, junior high, and high schools nationwide (including those of equivalent age), conducted between 1 September 2024 and 14 October 2024.

Medal Design (Obverse)

The design depicts a crane crafted from origami. It symbolises the hope that athletes will spread their wings and soar to great heights in competition. It incorporates traditional Japanese patterns considered auspicious.



•Medal Design (Reverse)

The design features intertwining lines, symbolising connections with people around the world.



The medals are crafted using a method where molten metal is pressed into moulds at high temperatures, achieving intricate reliefs and a beautiful surface finish. Skilled artisans in Tokyo, including traditional craftsmen, meticulously complete each stage of production, from mould design to polishing.





●Medal Ribbon

Precision-crafted by hand using the traditional technique of 'Tokyo kumihimo', a complex thread weaving method. The colours and patterns draw upon those favoured by people in the Edo period, 400 years ago, who laid the foundations for present-day Tokyo and Japan.



1.11 Universal Communication (UC)

Main Initiatives to Date

TMG will promote the spread of universal communication, allowing everyone to communicate equally, regardless of nationality or disability, to realize a Tokyo that connects "anytime, anywhere, with anyone."

At the TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS venues, we will utilize various digital technologies to ensure Games where everyone can communicate smoothly, regardless of nationality or disability.

Supporting Smooth Communication

UC technology will be used at all competition venues to support smooth communication between athletes and officials.



1.12 "Sign Yell" - a New Cheering Style for Deaf Athletes

"Visual Cheering" for Deaf Athletes

Typically, sports cheering often relies on voice and hearing, which means sound. And in "Def Sports," a world where athletes who cannot hear or who are hard of hearing are competing, spectators have had limited means of providing their support.

For the 100th anniversary of the Deaflympics, TMG developed "Sign Yell" by a team of mostly deaf people, working with deaf athletes.

It is based on the physical senses of people who perceive the world visually and the expression of Japanese Sign Language, so that everyone, whether they can hear or not, will be able to convey their support to deaf athletes.



Basic Elements of Sign Yell

Sign Yell is based on Japanese Sign Language and combine multiple movements to comprise the following basic elements:

- ·Go!
- ·You can do it!
- ·Grab the medal!

Wave your hands next to your face.

Move them forward vigorously.

[You can do it!]



(1) Place your right hand open on your chest.



(2) Slide it sideways, then clench your fists.



(3) Put both fists forward vigorously as if making a fist pump.

*Repeat (1) and (2) in the same way for the left hand.

[Grab the Medal!]



Make a diamond shape with both hands.



Place your left hand parallel to the ground, and with your right hand, make a circle with thumb and index finger.



While keeping your right hand in that pose, slide it under your left hand and raise it up.



Perform a grabbing motion with your right hand raised.

At the Games, we will be cheering with Sign Yell at multiple venues.

1.13 Emblem of the Games

The theme is the "circle", symbolising human connection.

The design depicts the "hand", a representative symbol of the deaf community. It expresses how, through the Deaflympics, engagement with sport and conversation fosters mutual exchange and community bonds. These connections, like a circle, blossom into a new future. The flower motif is based on cherry blossom petals.

Students from the Faculty of Industrial Technology, primarily from the Department of Integrated Design at the National University Corporation Tsukuba University of Technology – Japan's sole university for the deaf and visually impaired – reproduced and produced the emblem design proposals. The winning design was selected through a vote by secondary school pupils in Tokyo, including those from schools for the deaf.

1) Hand

The 'hand' is a representative symbol of the deaf community.

The 'hand' also expresses the desire for people to 'touch' with the competition and topic of the Deaflympics.

2) Circle

The 'circle' expresses the idea that after 'touch' the Deaflympics, people will gradually interact with each other and the interaction and community will be connected like a 'circle'.



3) Flower

The 'flower' expresses a scene that 'a new flower of the future will bloom' after the 'circle' will expand.

The motif of 'flower' is cherry blossom

4) Color

As many people from all over the world will gather for the Deaflympics, the colors of red, yellow, blue, and green were used to express diversity.

Yuriito, the Tokyo Metropolitan Government's sports promotion ambassador, will liven up the Games as the official mascot for the TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS. The official mascot leads the "TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS Support Team" to promote the Games and build momentum.

Yuriito was born as a character at the Sports Festival Tokyo 2013, and has since been active in a wide range of sports events in Tokyo as the Tokyo Sports Promotion Ambassador.

And this time, as the official mascots of the Games, Yuriito will wear a T-shirt using cherry blossom pink, the main colour of the tournament, which matches the Games Emblem, and will cheer athletes on with all its might.







2.1.2 Media Area Control

Media personnel holding a Media ID Card may cover events only in the designated media area without prior application, etc. The Media ID Card grants access to the media area (Area No. 4) at all venues.

The media areas at each venue include a photography area, interview space (mixed zone), media working space, and media seating. However, the availability and location of these spaces vary by venue. Please note that separate coverage applications are required for covering events outside the Media Area. For details, please refer to page 40.

This Media ID Card is issued on the condition that photographs and footage captured during this Games are used only for news and current affairs programmes. For coverage of these Games, the sale or loan of captured photographs and footage, the commercialisation of such material (including in photo books), display at exhibitions or similar venues, or any unauthorised secondary use of photographs or footage for commercial (sales) purposes are strictly prohibited.

- * If you anticipate using photographs or footage for purposes other than news programmes, such as commercial activities, please ensure you consult the Japanese Federation of the Deaf in advance.
- * Above prohibitions do not apply where broadcasting rights have been granted; however, a separate application is required for the granting of broadcasting rights.

2.2 Common Matters: Matters Concerning Coverage

2.2.1 General

If you carry your Media ID Card, you may conduct coverage in the media area at each venue without requiring a separate coverage application each time (access to the media area is restricted to those holding a Media ID Card or whose ID Card has been assigned Area No. 4).

However, for the opening and closing ceremonies and certain competition disciplines, coverage guidance will be issued in advance, therefore separate applications will be required. For details, please refer to Subsection 2.2.3 "Media Advisory" and the coverage requirements for each discipline on page 45 and onwards.

Areas without restrictions, such as spectator seating, may be accessed regardless of whether ID is held; however, coverage activities should in principle be conducted only within Media Areas.

If you wish to conduct coverage outside Media Areas, please apply for individual coverage as shown on page 40, Subsection 2.2.4 "Individual Coverage."

2.2.2 Considerations for Covering Deaf people

The method of communication differs depending on the athlete. Some athletes do not use sign language. Please anticipate multiple communication methods in advance and conduct your coverage with respect for the athletes.

2.2.3 Media Advisory

Basically, if you possess a Media ID Card, you may conduct coverage in Media Areas at each venue without a separate coverage application. However, for certain competitions, due to reasons such as area management, coverage is restricted to those who have applied in response to the coverage guidance issued in advance.

Coverage guidance will be issued for the following competitions, etc.

 - -15th, 16th, November: Orienteering at Hibiya Park and Hibiya Area

 - -25th, November: Athletics (Marathon) at the part of the Tokyo Expressway and Metropolitan Expressway Yaesu Route

2.2.4 Separate Coverage Application

- Separate coverage application

If you wish to conduct coverage outside Media Areas at Deaflympics Square and each competition venue, separate coverage applications are required in advance. In principle, applications should be made at least five working days prior to the intended coverage date.

[Deaflympics Square]

- -At Deaflympics Square, you may conduct coverage without carrying a Media ID Card.
- -Please apply for separate coverage via the link below. However, depending on the area and time, your application may be declined.

[Competition Venue]

- -Those who carry a Media ID Card or have submitted the Media Agreement may, in principle, conduct coverage within Media Areas at each competition venue (excluding certain competitions). However, if you wish to conduct coverage activities outside Media Areas (for example, wishing to capture from the spectator seating), you shall carry a Media ID Card or have submitted the Media Agreement, and a separate coverage application is required.
- -Please apply for separate coverage via the link below. However, depending on the area and time, your application may be declined.

- If you wish to cover volunteers or sign language interpreters
- -Even if you hold a media ID, please apply separate coverage.
- -Depending on the location or circumstances of the covered person's activities, your application may be declined. Furthermore, if there are numerous applicants for coverage, the operation side may designate the date, time and location, as well as invite the interested media for group coverage by surrounding interviewers, etc.
- -Specific coverage arrangements will be advised to each media organisation based on the details of their separate coverage applications.

-Please note that sign language interpreters cannot, in principle, be covered during their working hours.

- Capturing venue facilities, etc.

Capturing at each competition venue (interior and exterior views, facilities adjacent to the competition venue, etc.) is restricted in certain locations from the perspective of operational management, copyright and usage rights management as well as safety management. The available capturing locations for each competition venue are shown in the coverage guidelines for each venue on page 45 and onwards. To capture at locations not shown in the guideline, please directly obtain permission from the relevant facilities, etc.

2.2.5 Others

- Regarding Media Coverage of Practice Sessions
 Media coverage of any practices other than official matches (such as official training sessions) is prohibited.
- Bringing in Wireless Communication Devices
- -Bringing in of wireless communication devices such as shutter remote controls, wireless microphones, etc. for which you do not hold a Japanese domestic radio station licence, is prohibited.
- To use wireless communication devices within Japan, a radio station licence and a radio operator qualification are required.
- Please refrain from bringing in any wireless communication devices if you do not hold a radio station licence and radio operator qualification.
- -Wi-Fi facilities are available at each competition venue and the media workspace at Deaflympics Square.
 - Please use Wi-Fi within the facility for sending and receiving footage, etc. For use of mobile phones, Wi-Fi terminals, etc. brought in from overseas, please visit link below.



2.3 Media Centre

We will establish a media centre on the first floor of the Centre Building within Deaflympics Square (National Olympics Memorial Youth Centre).

- The interview booth is equipped with a back panel, five desks, fourteen chairs, one full-length mirror, and two writing boards.

(2) Media Seating and Stand Photo/Video Position

- Photo/Video Position may be restricted for event management reasons. Even within permitted areas, please be sure to follow the instructions of event officials and staff.

- Photography is permitted from the Photo/Video Position during the competition. Please be considerate and share the space.
- As a general rule, please take photos while sitting and rec<mark>ord videos</mark> while standing.
- Chairs, camera stands, etc. are not permitted.

(4) Interview Space

- Please strictly follow the instructions of event officials and staff to avoid disrupting Game operations and competition proceedings. Failure to comply with instructions or disruptive behaviour may result in removal from the venue.
- After the event, interviews can be conducted in turn in the interview space.
- Please ask questions in the following order: video media, then print journalist.
- Please bring your own sign language interpreter.
- Japanese Sign Language interpreters will be deployed in the Interview Space.
- Please be mindful of the sign language interpreter's position.
- No lighting or audio equipment will be installed for the coverage. When lighting is used, please take into account the need for the sign language interpreters to see the athletes.
- The use of hearing aids and cochlear implants are permitted in the Interview Space. However, wearing them cannot be forced upon athletes; please communicate appropriately based on the situation.
- The communication methods of each athlete are different. Please check with the athletes about their communication methods before interviewing them.

- First confirm with the athletes when they are available for interviews. Please note that the standard duration for interviews with individual athletes is five minutes per media outlet.

(5) Ceremony

- Media will be directed to the Medal Ceremony Photo/Video Position before the start of the Medal Ceremony.
- For the hammer throw event held at Oi Central Seaside Park Track and Field Facilities on Thursday, 20 November, the medal ceremony will be held the following day, Friday, 21 November, at Komazawa Olympic Park General Sports Ground Athletic Field.

(6) Media Working Space

- Power supply is available at each seat. Please share them considerately.
- Please keep valuables on your person at all times.
- The organizers will not be held responsible for any theft or accident, so please take care of your valuables.
- Results will be posted in the Media Working Space and also published on the website (https://deaflympics2025-games.jp/).

- Official records will be posted in the Media Working Space, as well as on the website.

(2) Information & Communication Accessibility

- Japanese Sign Language and International Sign Language interpreters will be provided for media scrums after medal ceremonies. However, sign language interpretation will generally not be arranged by the organizers for other occasions.
- The method of communication differs depending on the athlete. Please respect the athletes when conducting interviews.
- Some athletes do not use sign language. Please plan for multiple communication methods in advance.

(3) Competition Video Streaming

- Competition videos will be live-streamed on the official YouTube channel (https://www.youtube.com/@TOKYO2025DEAFLYMPICS).
- Finals will be filmed with multiple cameras and will include commentary, Japanese Sign Language and International Sign Language interpretation, and Japanese and English subtitles.
- Other matches will be filmed with fixed cameras and will not include commentary or sign language interpretation.

(4) Photography of Facility Exterior, etc.

- If you wish to photograph the venue's exterior, etc., please consult at the media reception desk in advance.
- *In principle, photography is permitted only in the designated areas.


1 Venue Overview

- No coverage or photo/video is permitted outside the designated area or at the practice venue.
- •Technical areas such as the competition headquarters, recording room and printing room are off limits.
- •Radio communication devices such as shutter remote controls and wireless microphones that do not have a radio station licence in Japan are not permitted. 
Overall view of Ariake Tennis Park











(2) Media Seating






(5) Ceremony
