1. 1. Competition Overview

The TOKYO 2025 Deaflympics Handball Competition will be held from Sunday, November 16 to Tuesday, November 25 at the Komazawa Olympic Park General Sports Ground Indoor Ball Court.

1. 3. Competition Format

For the TOKYO 2025 Deaflympics Handball Competition, the preliminary round will be conducted using a round-robin-format, while the final round will be conducted using a tournament format.

[Preliminary Round (Group Stages)]

During the preliminary round, each team will play against each other team in its own group once. Teams are drawn into groups as determined below:

Men: Sixteen (8) teams will be drawn into four (2) groups of four (4) teams each.

[Match System]

Mutual ranking in the group determined as follows:

In the preliminary round, two points are awarded for a win, one for a draw and none for a loss, qualify for the final round.

If two or more teams are tied on points after the completion of group matches, the following criteria will be applied in the order listed to determine their ranking:

- Points
- Head-to-head meetings (if more than two teams finish on the same score, the internal table is Calculated.
 - o Points in head-to-head meetings
 - o Goal difference in head-to-head meetings
 - o Number of goals scored in head-to-head meetings
- Total goal difference
- Total number of goals scored
- Lottery draw

[Final Round (Quarterfinals, Semifinals, Finals and Classifications)]

After the preliminary round is completed, all teams will advance to the final round as determined below:

Men:

•The top four teams from each group (1st to 4th place) advance to the quarterfinals, with the following matchups: (QF1: B1 v A4) and (QF2: B2 v A3) and (QF3: A1 v B4)

and (QF4: A2 v B3).

- The winners of the quarterfinals will advance to the semifinals: (winner of W13 v winner of W16) and (winner of W15 v winner of W14).
- The losers of the quarterfinals will advance to the playoffs for 5–8 places: (loser of L13 v loser of L16) and (loser of L15 v loser of L14).
- The winners of the semifinals will advance to the final.
- The losers of the semifinals will advance to the 3-4 places.

1. 4. Rules

Handball competitions shall be conducted in accordance with the following document.

1. 5. Competition Equipment

All equipment used during competition must comply with the IHF Rules and Regulations.

The official match ball is Molten A5000 size 3, approved by the IHF. The following ball sizes (i.e. circumference and weight) shall be used for the different age categories:

- 58 to 60 cm in circumference and 425 to 475 g in weight (IHF size
- 3) for men's senior and men's youth (aged 16 and older) players



1. 6. Competition Clothing

- Participants must wear competitive uniforms representing their nationality, duly registered and published in accordance with the IHF Rules and Regulations.
- •Participants must observe the Deaflympics Regulations regarding advertisements on their uniforms and clothing worn in the competition area.

2. 4. Competition Procedure


Hearing Aid Prohibited Area (ref: P16 MAP No2)

In accordance with Audiogram Regulations, athletes participating in the 2025 Summer Deaflympics in are strictly prohibited from using hearing aids or cochlear implant assistive devices during competition. This regulation applies specifically to restricted areas defined as follows:

●Indoor Ball Court Arena

[Inspection Timing and Inspectors]

- •First inspection (Before Warm-up): SD
- Second inspection (Before walk-in): Referee



Hearing Aid Violation

- •If an athlete wears a hearing device during the warm-up or the match within the restricted area
- → Immediate blue card (disqualification from the match)
- •The player is suspended for the next match.
- •If the same athlete commits this violation a second time (in the same competition),
- → the athlete will be automatically disqualified from the competition.
- •The violation must be documented by the match referees on the scoresheet and reported using the ICSD Violation Form.

Protests

Protest Filing Procedure

All sport related protests will be resolved in accordance with the IHF Rules and Regulations and will be adjudicated by the Protest Committee.

- •Any protest must be written in English on the Official Protest Form. The form and a deposit of USD\$100.00 must be given to the ICSD Handball Director within 60 minutes after the official public posting of results.
- The ICSD Handball Director will decide whether the protest is sport-related or eligibility-related. The Protest Committee will review all sport-related protests, and the ICSD Representative will review all eligibility-related protests.
- The deposit of USD\$100.00 will be returned to the applicant only if the protest is considered valid.

Protest Review Procedure

The Protest Committee will meet in the competition venue or a designated office at a time decided upon by the ICSD Handball Director.

- The ICSD Handball Director will chair of the Protest Committee.
- The Sport Liaison Officer (SLO) will be responsible for booking a meeting room and interpreters.
- •The SLO will contact and inform all members of the Protest Committee of the meeting time and location.
- The ICSD Handball Director will be responsible for liaising with the State Sports Association's Competition Manager.

• After adjudication, the ICSD Handball Director will forward the original Official Protest Form (along with the protest fee if the protest was denied) to the ICSD Secretariat. The SLO will forward a copy of the form to the Deaflympics Headquarters.

Players may warm up inside the FOP up to 50 minutes before the match. However, eating inside the FOP is not permitted. Please eat in the players' changing room.

Accredited / Team Seating (ref:P17 MAP No(5))


Athlete seating is provided on the East 2nd Floor, allowing teams to watch other handball matches held in the indoor ball court.

Player Entry Procedure



- · Players wait behind the support seats.
- · Line up with the captain at the front, followed by players in ascending order by jersey number.
- Team B enters first, running in a single line and forming their lineup.
- · After entering, face the bench and remain standing in line.
- · Then, Team A enters in the same manner.
- · Once Team A is lined up, each player is introduced one by one.
- · The referee, TD, and MO are introduced via announcement.

Escort Kids' Event

On the morning of November 25th, an escort kids' event where children will enter the court holding hands with the players will be held during the 7th place playoff entrance.

The kids will line up alongside the players as they prepare to enter and enter the court by holding hands. Pine resin on the players' hands is acceptable.

After entering, the kids will stand in front of the players during the introduction of players and national anthems.

The kids will exit the court immediately after both national anthems are finished

Team Timeouts

Each team is allowed two timeouts in the first half and two timeouts in the second half, for a total of four timeouts per game.

If there's a requirement to retrieve a green card from a team with just 5 minutes left in the match, please ensure that this detail is also included in the record.

2. 5. Post-Competition Procedures

Interview Space (ref: P16 MAP No6)

The interview space, where accredited media can interview players and coaches after the competition, is located at the FOP exit.

Players requested by the media will be escorted to the interview space after the match. On the 25th, medalists (captains only) will be guided to the interview space following the medal ceremony.

Victory Ceremony Orientation (ref:P16 MAP No(7))

Teams placing 1st to 3rd are requested to assemble at the Indoor Ball Court Arena for the victory ceremony orientation.

The 1st and 2nd place teams are scheduled to participate after the end of the 7th training session (scheduled for 18:00) or after the end of the 8th training session (scheduled for 19:10) on the 24th.

The 3rd place team is scheduled to participate after the end of the 3rd match on the 23rd (scheduled for 17:45 or later).

Detailed schedules will be provided by the Organizing Committee on the day of the event.

Victory Ceremony (ref:P16 MAP No2)

The tentative schedule for the victory ceremony is as follows:

Men's: 25 Nov 2025, 21:00 at Komazawa Olympic Park Indoor Ball Court

Athletes participating in the victory ceremony must wear sports shoes and official team overalls displaying their NDSF name on the back.

Team managers are requested to ensure that the medalists are readily available and appropriately dressed.

Carrying flags, taking photographs, or using cameras during the ceremony is prohibited.










Please make sure to remove all resin from the soles of your shoes before leaving the arena.


Smoking is prohibited inside the venue and throughout the park grounds. Smoking areas are not available.

3. 2. Venue Entry

The Indoor Ball Court will open from the arrival of the first team bus until the departure of the fourth team. Team buses will operate according to match schedule. Athletes who wish to arrive or depart outside these scheduled times must arrange their own transportation. Please note that on training days, entry outside the assigned training time is not permitted.

All delegations must collect their ID cards at Deaflympics Square by the designated date and time of their venue entry. Please follow staff instructions when moving from the parking area.





3. 3. ID Card

- •ID cards will be issued at Deaf Square. They will not be issued at the competition venues.
- Each ID card is personal and non-transferable. Please carry it with you at all times within the venue zones.
- •You are also required to present your ID card when boarding buses to the competition venues, so please make sure to have it with you at all times.
- If your ID card is damaged or lost, contact the Games Headquarters immediately. Afterwards, you must visit the ID Center at Deaf Square in person to complete the reissuance procedure.

3. 4. Transportation Services

- •For the latest transportation schedule, please refer to the "Transportation Services" page on the Athletes' Delegation website. Bus timetables and designated boarding/alighting locations will be posted there. Please check the timetable daily, as changes may occur the day before.
- •Team transportation buses are available only for your team's matches and training. Departure times and destinations cannot be changed for personal reasons.
- •Team buses depart on time. Please arrive at the bus stop well in advance to avoid missing your bus. If competitions or training are delayed, departure times will be adjusted accordingly on the day.
- •Before departure, the delegation must confirm that all team members are present .
- •If your team no longer requires the shuttle bus (e.g., due to canceled practice), please contact the LOC immediately.
- •The bus used for the outbound trip may differ from the one used for the return trip. Please ensure you do not leave any personal belongings on the bus.
- An ID card is required to board the bus, so please carry it with you at all times.

3. 5. Venue Services

- Changing Rooms/Showers (ref: P16 MAP No®)

The B1 floor features team-specific changing rooms and shower facilities. Each changing room is equipped with showers.

Towels are not provided, so please bring your own.

Restrooms are available on every floor; please refer to the venue map on page 16.

Light Meal Service (ref: P16 MAP No9)

During competition hours, beverages and the following light snacks will be available in the athlete changing rooms. No advance order is required.

Light meals may be consumed in the changing rooms and athlete seating areas.

- Bananas
- Energy bars
- Sandwiches

- Beverage & Ice Service (ref: P16 MAP No(10))

Beverages (mineral water) and ice will be available in the changing rooms.

- Sports Information Desk (SID) (ref:P16 MAP No11)

The Sports Information Desk (SID) is located at the entrance on the B1 floor of the Indoor Ball Court.

From November 13 to 25, 2025, the SID will open 15 minutes before the first bus arrives at the venue (8:15) and will close after the last bus departs (22:00).

The SID provides information on competitions and results. Please feel free to ask if you have any questions.
