In November this year, the Deaflympics, an international sports competition for deaf athletes, will be held in Japan for the first time.

The International Committee of Sports for the Deaf (hereinafter referred to as ICSD), the Japanese Federation of the Deaf, the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the Tokyo Sport Benefits Corporation wish to widely promote the Tokyo 2025 Deaflympics (hereinafter referred to as "the Games") both in Japan and overseas through members of the media. By sharing the appeal and value of the Deaflympics, Deaf sports, and Deaf culture, we hope to contribute to the realisation of an inclusive society.



4 Notes on Coverage

- Only companies that have obtained prior approval to broadcast or distribute a programme of 45 minutes or longer covering the ceremony on the day of the event will be permitted to do so.
- Regarding the photo/video positions, priority will be given to the positions designated for broadcasting operators, and information will then be provided to media organizations that have applied for coverage.
- Please note that priority will be given to television broadcasters affiliated with the Japan Broadcasting Corporation, the Japan Commercial Broadcasters Association, and the Japan Cable and Telecommunications Association (limited to one vehicle and up to three representatives per network), as well as to newspapers affiliated with the Japan Newspaper Publishers & Editors Association (limited to two representatives per company) and to overseas media.
- If there are more applicants for coverage than the number of media seats remaining, a lottery will be held.
- After the application deadline, notifications regarding the approval or disapproval of coverage will be sent sequentially to the e-mail address provided at the time of application.
 - If you have not been notified by Thursday 13 November, please contact event management using the contact details at the end of this document.
- Due to the convenience of the venue, the seating position (block) where each programme is to be filmed during the ceremony will be designated in advance.
- · Please refrain from interviewing or filming outside the photo/video position designated by the project





organisation.

- Please be aware that due to the number of applications for coverage as well as safety considerations, restrictions may be placed on the use of tripods and other equipment.
- The organisation will provide footage of the Opening and Closing Ceremonies. If you wish to use it, please refer to the application details below and confirm the 'Guidelines for the use of video footage of the Tokyo 2025 Opening and Closing Ceremonies' before submitting your application.







•Due to the nature of the event, the photo/video position will be announced on the day.

Please note that the Sprint Distance on Saturday 15 will be divided into a start area and a finish area. As it takes approximately 10 minutes to walk between both areas, it may not be possible for one photo/video crew to photo/video both the start and finish of the same athlete.

Other areas in the park will also be available for photo/video.

- •Tripods and other camera stands are allowed, but their use may be restricted depending on the conditions in the photo/video position.
- •During the event, you can photo/video from the photo/video position that will be shown to you on the day. Please use the space in a concessionary manner.
- •Please note for the events that have many requests for coverage in a particular photo/video position, the media desk will be open on a first-come, first-served basis.
- •When moving around during the event, please follow the instructions of the guidance staff so as not to impede the progress of the athletes.
- ·It is not possible to take up a space across the day.
- •Interviews with athletes are not permitted in the photo/video position.
- •If one representative of an affiliate has already applied for use of the event footage, the footage can be downloaded from the cloud and used without editing or processing for Information & Communication Accessibility (sign language interpretation, subtitles, etc.). Downloaded footage can be shared and used among affiliated stations.

(iv) Interview Space (Hibiya Library & Museum)

- ·After the event, interviews can be conducted in turn in the interview space.
- •For information on calling out to athletes, please ask the athletes in front of the stairs outside the Hibiya Library & Museum.
- ·Hand-held whiteboards are available for free use.
- •If there is a concentration of requests for interviews for a particular athlete, on-the-spot interview by surrounding reporters may be adopted. •Questions in this case should be asked in the order of video, then print journalist.
- ·Japanese sign language interpreters will be deployed in the interview space.
- •The audio of the Japanese sign language interpreter is available for use by the media.







- •No lighting or audio equipment will be provided for coverage. When using lighting, please ensure that both the sign language interpreter and the athlete can see each other clearly.
- •Please give consideration to the position of the Japanese sign language interpreter.
- ·Athletes can wear hearing aids and other devices in the interview space.
- •The communication methods of each athlete are different. Please check with the athletes about their communication methods before interviewing them.
