1.3 Competition Format

Singles

1st stage is a round-robin system. Best of five games.

The top two players from each group advance to 2nd stage.

2nd stage is a straight knockout system as tournament. Best of seven games.

Doubles (including Mixed)

Doubles is a straight knockout system as tournament. Best of seven games.

Team

Best of five matches (New Swaythling Cup system, 5 singles)

1st stage is a round-robin system.

The top two teams from each group advance to the second stage.

2nd stage is a tournament.

2.Competition

2.1 Competition Schedule

2.2 Practice Schedule

*The practice schedule has been communicated to each team by the SD.

2.3 Call Area(MAP No(1))

Players must assemble in the Call Area 30 minutes before the match. Please be mindful not to be late.

Players should always check the progress of the match on the monitors located in the SID or call area.

The call area has desks labeled with court numbers. Go to the desk corresponding to the court number where your match will be held and meet up with the umpire assigned to your match.

2.4 Technical Meeting(MAP No2)

The technical meeting will be held at Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium, Conference Room 1, on the following date. Each NDSF is allowed to send up to two representatives to the technical meeting, at least one of whom must be a deaf person. An interpreter may also be present if necessary.

- For Doubles and Singles 17 November 2025 10:00 a.m.
- •For Team 22 November 2025 10:00 a.m.

2.5 Hearing Devices Restricted Area

(MAP No(1) and (3) and (4))

In accordance with <u>Audiogram regulations</u>, athletes participating in TOKYO 2025 DEAFLYMPICS are strictly prohibited from using hearing aids or cochlear implant assistive devices during competition. This regulation applies specifically to the restricted areas defined

as follows.

The restricted area covers the entire sports hall field, including the Call Arena, the table tennis tables, the team benches and the training fields, and extends to the edge of the spectator area. (Technical Regulations 7.1.1.1)

2.6 Information Accessibility in Table Tennis

Multiple sign language interpreters are stationed at the venue, wearing navy blue staff uniforms. Interpreters include both International Sign Language interpreters and Japanese Sign Language interpreters. International Sign Language interpreters wear a green sticker marked "IS" on their uniforms.

Some volunteers wearing pink uniforms may also wear an "IS" sticker, but please note their support may be limited to basic expressions.



2.7 Interview Area (MAP No⁽⁵⁾)

The interview area where accredited media interview athletes and coaches after competitions is located along the exit route from the FOP.

2.8 High-Five with Children Upon Entry

We will hold a welcome high-five event with children at select games.

Just before the game starts, when entering the FOP from the call area, players will enter while high-fiving the children.

The children will stand on both sides directly in front of the entrance. Players will high-five the children on both sides with both hands while heading toward the court.

For games featuring this event, staff will explain the event flow before the players enter.

3.Venue

Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium (1-17-1 Sendagaya, Shibuya-ku, Tokyo)

The table tennis events for the Tokyo 2025 Deaflympics will be held at Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium.

Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium served as the venue for gymnastics and water polo during the 1964 Tokyo Olympics, and as the venue for table tennis during the 2020 Tokyo Olympics and Paralympics.





3.1 Access

By train

Close to **Sendagaya Station** on the JR Sobu Line Close to **Kokuritsu-kyogijo Station** (Exit A4) on the Toei Oedo Line


By bus




B1F Main Arena




B2F Sub Arena

3.3 Venue Entry

Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium will be open from 8:00 AM until one hour after the conclusion of competitions or award ceremonies.

All delegations require an ID issued at Deaf Square to enter the competition venue.

The entrance for athletes and team staff is located at the rear of the building, not the main entrance.

Enter via the second parking lot of Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium.

[If arriving by the athlete bus]

The second parking lot at Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium is the drop-off point for athlete buses. Staff will guide you from the bus drop-off point to the entrance.

[If you arrived by other means]

- 1. Climb the stairs from the plaza in front of Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium.
- 2. Proceed toward the arrow while keeping Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium on your left.
- 3. Descend the stairs at the end of the arrow.
- 4. After descending the stairs, turn right and walk along the path.
- 5. The entrance to the Second Parking Lot is on your right; enter the Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium Second Parking Lot from there.
- 6. Follow the arrow inside the parking lot to find the entrance for athletes and team staff.



3.4 ID Card

ID cards will be issued at Deaf Square. They will not be issued at the venue.

ID cards are personal and non-transferable.

Please always carry them with you within the venue.

Additionally, your ID card is required when boarding athlete buses to each competition venue, so be sure to carry it with you.

If your ID card is damaged or lost, contact the Games Headquarters immediately. After that, you must come to the ID Center (Deaf Square) in person to complete the reissuance procedure.

3.5 Transportation Service

We will provide athlete buses running between the competition venues and Deaf Square, and between the competition venues and Ariake.

The athlete buses will operate according to the following schedule.

At Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium, the second parking lot is the Pick-up/drop-off point for athlete buses.

An ID card is required for boarding.

3.6 Venue Services

3.6.1 Warm-up Area (MAP No4)

Players may warm up in the sub-arena.

Consumption of food is not permitted inside the sub-arena; please use the player lounge located in front of the sub-arena.

Practice balls will not be provided.

3.6.2 Changing Rooms/Showers (MAP No6)

The B2 floor features separate changing rooms and shower rooms for men and women. Each changing room also has a restroom. Towels are not provided, so please bring your own.

3.6.3 Seats for athletes and Team Staff (MAP No?)

We have designated areas in the spectator seating reserved exclusively for athletes and team staff. These areas may be used during intermissions and for viewing the game.

Food and drink are permitted.

3.6.4 Food and Beverage Services (MAP No®)

During competition hours, beverages and the following light snacks will be provided in front of the sub-arena.

No advance orders are required.

Consumption of food is not permitted inside the sub-arena; please use the player lounge located in front of the sub-arena.

On practice days, only water will be provided.

- •Banana
- •Energy bar
- •Filled & Stuffed Bread
- Water

3.6.5 Sports Information Desk (SID) (MAP No⁽⁹⁾)

The SID is located within the sub-arena, which includes a warm-up area.

From November 16 to 24, 2025, the SID will open 30 minutes before the first bus arrives at the venue and close after the last bus departs.

The SID provides information and results for various events, so please feel free to ask if you have any questions.

3.6.6 Rubber Exchange Station (MAP No10)

We provide tables for use when replacing rubber in the call area. Rubber, Scissors, and Adhesive are not provided.

3.6.7 Racket Control (MAP No(1))

Players participating in matches designated by the referee will undergo inspections using testing equipment in the Racket Control Room for the following items, in addition to the racket checks performed by the Referee and Assistant Referees:

- •flatness, racket covering thickness, even thickness and continuity of layers
- •presence of harmful or volatile substances

Players not subject to mandatory inspections may also undergo pre-match inspections.
